

## ROBERT E. LANG, Ph.D. BIO

Robert E. Lang is Director of the Metropolitan Institute at Virginia Tech in Alexandria, Virginia, and a Professor in Urban Affairs and Planning in Virginia Tech's School of Planning and International Affairs. Dr. Lang is the Editor of the scholarly journal *Housing Policy Debate*, and Associate Editor for the *Journal of the American Planning Association*. In 2007, Dr. Lang was named a Senior Fellow of the Brookings Institution in Washington, DC.

Dr. Lang received a Ph.D. in Sociology/Urban Planning from Rutgers University, where he also taught sociology and urban studies. He was a Research Associate at the Center for Urban Policy Research at Rutgers University. Dr. Lang's research specialties include, suburban studies, real estate development, world cities, demographic and spatial analysis, housing and the built environment, and metropolitan governance. He has authored over 130 academic and professional publications on a wide range of topics, and has developed many new urban planning concepts such as "Boomburbs," "Edgeless Cities," and "Megapolitan Areas." Dr. Lang has managed nearly 3 million dollars in research grants since 2000. He has also given over 150 talks since that date.

Dr. Lang's research has been featured in the *USA Today*, *New York Times*, *Washington Post*, *Wall Street Journal*, *US News and World Report* and reported on by *NPR*, *CNN*, *MSNBC*, *FOX News*, and *ABC World News Tonight*. Dr. Lang's work includes the book *Edgeless Cities: Exploring the Elusive Metropolis*, which is published by the Brookings Institution Press. He is also co-author of three edited volumes on the census titled *Redefining Urban and Suburban America: Evidence from Census 2000*, also by the Brookings Institution Press. Dr. Lang's newest book titled *Boomburbs: the Rise of America's Accidental Cities* was published in June 2007.
